Greetings from Sidney Museum and Archives! My name is Michael Goodchild, Executive Director at the Museum, and I am writing to you today to humbly request your support of our Waterfront Signage Project.

For this project, we are undertaking a revitalization of 11 public interpretive signs that were installed in 2009, primarily along Sidney's scenic waterfront. As you may know, many of these signs are, in places, damaged and illegible due to years of weathering and require replacement. Furthermore, as part of the revitalization process, it is vital to update panel content to tell a more complete story of Saanich Peninsula, accounting for ecological history, previously underrepresented communities crucial to the story of Sidney, and including SENĆOŦEN language and cultural knowledge of the WSÁNEĆ People.

This project is being partially funded by the BC 150 Time Immemorial Grant Program, but Sidney Museum & Archives is seeking additional financial support to account for increased design and fabrication costs, as well as providing fair compensation to WSÁNEĆ Elders and Knowledge-keepers for their collaboration in this project.

Our goal is to ensure that the new interpretive signs will accurately reflect the richness and diversity of the ongoing story of Sidney and the Saanich Peninsula for the benefit of residents and visitors alike for years to come.
